## T.I.P. Rural Electric Cooperative to Pay \$330,120.00 in Property Taxes

The following is the breakdown, by county, of the property taxes to be paid by your REC for 2022-23:

To avoid damage to cooperative property, future service problems and danger to yourself and others, please watch where you burn.
