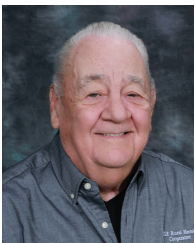

RONALD L. HOFFMAN (Incumbent)

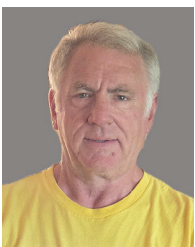
Ronald L. Hoffman lives six and one-half miles southeast of Sigourney in West Lancaster Township, Keokuk County, where he has resided since 1967.
